Volunteer Opportunities

Greeters

Several people are required each day of the meet to greet spectators, volunteers and participants as they come into the arena. Obviously, they are to welcome and guide people to the areas of the facility that they require. Skaters-the dressing rooms, spectators-the appropriate arena, volunteers-the volunteer area (yet to be designated)

Kitchen Help

During the course of the meet drinks, snacks and a hot lunch are provided to the volunteers and coaches. The kitchen help will assist in keeping stocks of food on the tables replenished and the area clean. The volunteers arrive early in the morning to ensure that coaches and volunteers can grab a snack and coffee before the meet gets underway.

Tim Horton's Donation & Delivery

We require someone to make contact with a local Tim Horton's to arrange for a donation of coffee and bagels/muffins for each day of the meet. This person will also arrange for pick up and drop off of the donation, as well as return of the coffee containers.

50/50 Tickets

This is a perfect job for younger volunteers. They are required for each day of the meet to sell tickets which will be drawn each day of the meet.

Medal Coordinator

One person required to arrange for the medal presentation to athletes. Medals are awarded at the banquet on Saturday night for those won up to that point, and also awarded at the end of the Championships on Sunday for the remaining medals that were won on that day. The coordinator will be responsible for arranging for volunteers to carry the medals and for the VIPs that will award the medals.

Athlete Parade Coordinator

A parade will be held during the opening ceremonies of the Championships. This person will be required to arrange the order of athletes entering the arena and ensuring that they arrive at the specified time onto the ice surface.

VIP Greeter

Volunteer required to greet the VIPs as they arrive for the opening and closing ceremonies. They will be responsible to ensure that the VIPs are available to fulfill their obligations such as speaking, presenting, etc.

Medal Carriers

Young skaters would be ideal to carry the medals out to the VIP who will be making the presentation of the medals to the athletes. These volunteers will need to arrive ½ hour before the presentation.

Set Up/Take Down of Ceremonies

Several volunteers required to assist in the setup and take down of the opening and closing ceremonies.

Facilities

This committee requires many volunteers over the course of the week leading up to the Championships, as well as following the championships. Assistance is required for the following activities:

Tuesday, March 24 – Set up of the official's platform

Tuesday, March 24 – Removal of all rink glass

Tues/Wed – Mat setup/takedown

Tuesday, March 24 – mark lanes and finish lines

Wednesday, March 25 – set up of tables and chairs

Each of these activities will be requires at least six volunteers. The more volunteers, the faster the work gets done.
